

A Neurologist's Guide to MOC

What Is Maintenance of Certification?

MOC is an initiative of the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS), an organization of 24 approved medical specialty boards, including the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN), to ensure that physician specialists offer quality patient care through an ongoing process of selfimprovement and performance improvement. Maintenance of Certification (MOC) is not an American Academy of Neurology-mandated initiative.


The ABPN is a member of the ABMS, providing certification and MOC for the professions of psychiatry and neurology. The ABPN MOC program is currently comprised of four components:

- Part I: Professional Standing (Licensure)
 - Licenses must be kept up-to-date in your ABPN Physician Folios account
- Part II: Self-assessment and CME
 - Gain credit for up to two different types of Non-CME Self-assessment Activity Options
 - Starting in 2016 includes one-time Patient Safety Course requirement
- Part III: Cognitive Expertise Exam
- Part IV: Improvement in Medical Practice (also known as Performance in Practice and "PIP")
 - NEW in February 2016: Diplomates now choose ONE Clinical Module OR Feedback Module activity to complete the PIP Unit. This quality improvement exercise is designed to identify and implement areas for improvement based on the review of one's own patient charts Clinical Module OR feedback from peers or patients via a questionnaire/survey Feedback Module.

All certificates issued by the ABPN after October 1, 1994, are time-limited certificates. Diplomates must pass a recertification exam every 10 years in order to maintain their certification.


